Programme INTI for the integration of third country nationals

INTI is a European Union programme funding preparatory actions promoting the integration in the Member States of people who are not EU citizens.

The principle is to promote new and innovative ways of integrating immigrants, building wherever possible on past experience.

INTI encourages co-operation between Member States and the creation of transnational partnerships and networks.

Aims

INTI aims to promote dialogue with civil society, develop integration models, evaluate best practices, and set up networks at European level.

Priority will also be given to actions enhancing the empowerment of migrants and contributing to a transnational and constructive dialogue.

Eligible organisations and partners

Actions may be proposed by legal persons registered in one of the 25 Member States, which may be national, regional or local authorities, private or public companies, or NGOs.

Actions may include partners and participants from Third Countries on a non-cost basis (not eligible for EU funding).

Projects should be trans-national, involving 4 legal persons plus the applicant (who will be the project leader) in 5 Member States.

Activities

The Programme is structured in 4 strands:

Strand A: Support of networks, exchange of information and best practices

Strand B: Information and dialogue

Strand C: Improved knowledge of integration issues

Strand D: Innovative projects

Each Call will establish a priority theme around which to build the project proposal.

What scale of funding is available?

The EU contribution cannot exceed 80% of the total eligible project costs. The minimum grant is €100,000 per project, and the maximum grant is €900,000 per project.

Duration

The duration of projects shall not exceed 18 months.

Calls for proposals

A yearly Call for proposals will be launched by the EC and published in the Official Journal.
